

Emergency Removal

A student may be removed immediately from a class or subject by the Principal, without first attempting corrective action, provided that the Principal has good and sufficient reason to believe that the student's presence poses an immediate and continuing threat of substantial disruption of the class, subject or educational process of the student's school. Principal will already have determined a law enforcement agency to call for emergency assistance. S/he will ask an older student to call that number. The law enforcement agency will come and take the child to another part of the school or, if there is no alternative, to the student's home where the student will be turned over to the parent or guardian. The removal shall continue only until:

1. The danger or threat ceases, or
2. The Principal acts to impose discipline, impose a short-term or long-term suspension, or recommends expulsion.

The Principal shall meet with the student as soon as reasonably possible following the student's removal and take or initiate appropriate corrective action or punishment. In no case shall the student's opportunity for such meeting be delayed beyond commencement of the next school day.
