

Aides (Classroom, Library, Etc.)

Aides are under the supervision of the Principal, and a teacher to whom the Principal may have delegated responsibility for close direction. Also, by job description, the nature of the work accomplished by aides will encompass a variety of tasks that may be inclusive of "limited instructional duties."

Section 20-3-324(2), MCA, gives the Trustees the power and duty to "employ and dismiss . . . teachers' aides . . . and any other personnel considered necessary to carry out the various services of the district."

Aides are employed by the Dayton Public School mainly to assist the teacher. An aide is an extension of the teacher who legally has the direct control and supervision of the classroom or playground and responsibility for control and the welfare of the students.

It is the responsibility of the Principal to recommend to the Board adequate training for an aide. This training should consider the unique situations in which an aide works, and should be designed to cover the general contingencies that might be expected to pertain to that situation.
